TEACHING GUIDE



What? It's the grand finale of North American professional baseball, where the best clubs compete to become champions. 🏆

Who? The teams competing are the Toronto Blue Jays and the Los Angeles Dodgers. The latter won the series. 🏆

Where? The games were played alternately in Toronto (Canada) and Los Angeles (United States).

When? The series began on October 24, 2025, and ended on Saturday, November 2.

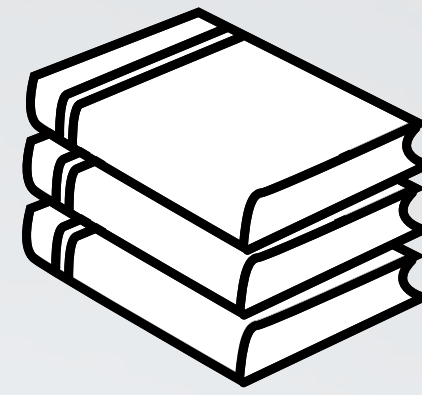
Why is it important? Because this final series decides the best baseball club of the season!

🎯 For this activity, your goal will be **to learn a little more about baseball.** 🏆



OBJECTIVES

- Understand sports news related to the World Series.
- Read and extract essential information from an informative text.
- Analyze and interpret statistical data related to sports results.
- Write a short, structured article to communicate clearly and effectively.
- Develop independence in completing an online activity.



SUBJECTS

- **English.** Reading an informative text and writing a short article.
- **Mathematics.** Analyzing and comparing sports results (data table).
- **Social studies/General culture.** Learning about a North American sporting event (World Series).



COMPETENCIES

- Using information: Using different types of information (video, text, tables) to understand the situation.
- Exercising critical judgment: Analyzing and giving your opinion on current sports events.
- Effective working methods: Organizing your work to complete the activity independently.
- Communicating appropriately: Expressing your ideas clearly in writing.



DURATION

- Around 60 minutes



GETTING STARTED

- Introduce the topic: The World Series is a major sporting event that is widely followed in North America.
- Mention that the Dodgers won and that the activity will help students understand why this event was important.
- Generate interest: *"How do you explain this historic victory for the Dodgers?"*



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QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

STEP 1 — Learn a Little More About Baseball. Video and answers to four comprehension questions.

- **Q1** — A game consists of nine innings.
- **Q2** — Three outs are required to switch from offense to defense, and vice versa.
- **Q3** — There are nine players per team on the field.
- **Q4** — It is a diamond shape.

STEP 2 — A Highly Anticipated Matchup! Reading of a text about the World Series and to answer three comprehension questions.

Q5 — It is the major professional baseball championship.

Q6 — In Toronto, Canada, and Los Angeles, United States.

Q7 — Because the Blue Jays want to repeat their 1993 championship victory.

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STEP 3 — The Series Recap. Analysis of the scoreboard and answer two to comprehension questions. Writing of a short news article about the World Series.

The text must include:

- A catchy title;
- A short summary of the series (who, what, where);
- A personal opinion (e.g., “In my opinion...,” “I believe that...”);
- A conclusion.

TO WRAP UP

- Briefly review the activity with the group.
- Invite students to create a mind map about what they have learned about baseball, the World Series, and the role of sports journalists. Suggest that students watch a video summary of one of the games to compare their mathematical observations with actual game footage. Invite a few students to share:
 - something new they learned about the World Series,
 - an observation drawn from the mathematical results,
 - an interesting element of their article.
- Highlight key learning points (e.g., reading an informative text, analyzing data, expressing an opinion).
