


# Trump-Xi Meeting (November 5, 2025)

### TEACHING GUIDE

i What? The meeting between US President Donald Trump and Chinese President Xi Jinping, during which the two countries discussed trade, technology, and international cooperation.


**⚠ Who?** The world's two largest economies: the United States (represented by Donald Trump) and China (represented by Xi Jinping).

- Where? The meeting took place in Busan, South Korea, on neutral ground.
- When? Thursday, October 30, 2025.
- ? Why is this important? Because these are the two most powerful countries in the world. It matters!
- For this activity, your goal will be to learn a little more about these two superpowers and their leaders.



#### **OBJECTIVES**

- Identify the two main leaders and briefly understand their backgrounds.
- Compare the United States and China using simple data: population, capital, currency, size of territory.
- Understand the commercial dimension of the rivalry (Apple vs. Huawei).
- Develop the ability to search for reliable information (Wikipedia/Vikidia).
- Read and fill out a comparison table independently.



#### **SUBJECTS**

- **English.** Informative reading, short answers.
- **Geography.** Location of countries, capitals, international comparisons.
- **Civics.** Understanding international relations and the role of leaders.
- Technology and society. Global companies (Apple, Huawei).
- **Digital skills.** Reliable research in Wikipedia/Vikidia.



### **COMPETENCIES**

- Reading and comprehension. Extract key information from short articles (Wikipedia/Vikidia).
- Organization and analysis. Fill in comparative tables.
- Civic culture. Understand the issues at stake between major powers.
- Communication. Formulate brief, clear, and informative responses.



#### **DURATION**

About 60 minutes



### **GETTING STARTED**

- Display a photo of the two leaders at the meeting.
- Ask the students a few questions:
  - "Why do you think the leaders of major countries need to meet?"
  - "Can you name a country that is very important to the United States? And to China?"
- Introduce the context of the activity:
  - "Today, we're going to find out who Donald Trump and Xi Jinping are, then compare their two countries, and finally analyze two major companies that symbolize their rivalry: Apple and Huawei."
