TEACHING GUIDE

i What? The Golden Globe Awards, a major ceremony where awards are given to the best films and television series of the year.


Who? We're talking about actors, actresses, directors, but also the films and series watched by millions of people worldwide.

Where? The ceremony is held in the United States, usually in Los Angeles, a very important city for cinema.

When? The 2026 Golden Globes took place on Sunday, January 11, 2026, in the evening.

Why is it important? Because these awards help to promote good work, influence what people watch, and kick off awards season.

For this activity, your goal will be to learn a little more about the 83rd Golden Globe Awards ceremony.




OBJECTIVES

- Discover a major international cultural event
- Understand the role of a jury and the award categories
- Develop critical thinking skills regarding cultural works
- Express opinions clearly and in a structured way
- Use vocabulary related to film and emotions



SUBJECTS

- **Social Studies / General Knowledge**
 - Discovering a global cultural event
 - Understanding the role of awards and juries
 - Introduction to film industry professions
- **English**
 - Reading instructions
 - Comprehension of informational texts
 - Written production (mini-speech)



COMPETENCIES

- Read and interpret visual and textual documents
- Research and select relevant information
- Justify an opinion using examples
- Produce a short argumentative text (mini-speech)
- Communicate clearly orally



DURATION

- About 60 minutes



GETTING STARTED

- Show a picture or short video of the Golden Globes.
- Ask the students:
 - "Have you ever heard of the Golden Globes?"
 - "Why do you think films and TV shows receive awards?"
- Write down a few answers before starting the activity.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

STEP 1 — And the winner is... Research of the winners on Wikipedia and filling of a table containing the categories and the winners.

	Category	Winner
Award for the best written story (dialogue, plot, ideas).	Best screenplay	Paul Thomas Anderson
Award for a film made with drawings, animation, or digital effects.	Best animated motion	KPop Demon Hunters
Award for the music that accompanies the film and helps create emotions.	Best original score	Ludwig Göransson
Award for a short series with few episodes.	Best limited series	Adolescence
Award for a serious or moving film that tells a powerful story.	Best drama	Hamnet

STEP 2 — One-Night Critic. Viewing of a short animated film (6 minutes) and formulation of a review of the film.

- **Q1 — It's an animated comedy film.**
- **Q2 to Q4 — Personal answers.**

STEP 3 — On the red carpet. Writing of a short thank-you speech (50 to 100 words).

- **Q5 — Personal answers.**




WRAPPING UP

- Review the main discoveries: what the Golden Globes taught us and the role they play in the world of film and television.
- Ask the student to express in one sentence what surprised them most about the categories, the clips viewed, or the winners' choices.
- Remind everyone that the Golden Globes are not just an awards ceremony, but also a way to discover works, talents, and different perspectives that influence public culture and emotions.


Now you know a little more about the winners of the 83rd Golden Globe Awards!
